

**BUFFALO TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 34 -2001**  
**ORDINANCE TO REGULATE PARKING**

AND NOW, come the Supervisors for the Township of Buffalo, Washington County, Pennsylvania, and enact this Ordinance to be known as Parking Regulation for the Township of Buffalo, and set forth as follows:

1. Definitions and Interpretation.

(a) Words and phrases when used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or as hereafter amended, enacted or re-enacted, except where the context clearly indicated a different meaning.

(b) In this ordinance, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

2. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of an ordinance or as amendments to ordinances of the Township of Buffalo.

3. Parking Prohibited at All Times in Certain Locations.

Parking shall be prohibited at all times in the following location:

<u>Highway</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Location</u>
Highland Ridge Road	Both	Intersection of Highland Ridge Road and U.S. Route 40, and South on Highland Ridge Road, as posted.

Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall upon conviction thereof be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this

Ordinance for violation of such nature and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere, to a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$25 and costs of prosecution, or, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment for one day for each \$10 of such fine and costs.

In case of emergency, or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, the Supervisors, through the Road Department, may restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.

In case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, the Supervisors, through the Road Department, may establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.

The invalidity of any section of this Ordinance shall not effect the remaining sections. Any ordinance or resolution not consistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

ORDAINED AND ENACTED into an Ordinance and passed by the Board of the Township Supervisors for the Township of Buffalo on the 7th day of March, 2001.
